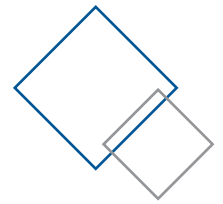


Tadley Youth Centre - The Point

Timber framed new build.

Located behind the existing community centre in a built up residential area, the building comprised a distinctively shaped timber frame, ply walls and ceilings, and a polished resin ground floor. The large windows and glass entrance doors contribute to the bright and airy feel of the building that blends seamlessly into its immediate environment.

A kitchen and servery is located on the ground floor along with a hall and small breakout / project areas. Upstairs is a mezzanine balcony with another hall, music studio and chill out area. Bean bags are the order of the day for relaxing, with screens mounted on the walls for gaming / viewing entertainment.

Externally there are new table tennis tables, in situ cast concrete benches plus hard and soft landscaping. Also an area has been left for the young people to decide the best purpose and use of the space.

This modern build has a BREEAM rating of 'Very Good'.

On completion, the customer and end users were overjoyed with our efforts and highlighted our open and collaborative approach as a key factor in the success.

The project has been awarded the prestigious RIBA Journal MacEwen Award which celebrates architecture for the common good.
